Who are our visitors

- ► 14.9m overnight visitors
 - > 5m in Edinburgh and the Lothians.
- Majority of these were from elsewhere in Great Britain
- ► Also have over 151m day visits
- Numbers are growing up by almost 4.3% between 2016 and 2017

Why do they come?

> 50% - scenery and landscape

> 33% history and culture

> 24% have been before

> 23% want to get away from it all

How do they get here?

- First Time Visitors
- 58% arrived by plane
- direct (39%) indirect (19%) •63% arrived to Edinburgh airport •
- 28% arrived in Scotland by car •
 own car (17%) hire car (9%) •
 friend / family car (2%)
- 11% travelled by train (within UK)

- European Visitors
- 72% arrived by plane direct(56%) indirect (16%)
- 71% arrived to Edinburgh airport
- A quarter travelled by car (24%)
 own / friend / family car (15%)
 hire car (9%)
- 9% used boats, ships or ferries

What do they do when they are here?

- > 74% go sightseeing
- ► 60% visit castles or historic houses
- > 54% go for short walks or strolls
- ► 46% go shopping
- ▶ 46% visit churches or cathedrals
- ▶ 45% go to museums or galleries
- ► (38% Long walk/hike/ramble)

How do they get around?

- > 49% use their own car
- > 33% walked
- > 28% used public bus or coach
- > 23% used the train
- > 21% used a boat/ship or ferry
- Location (77%) and VFM (56%) most important in booking accommodation

Difficulties

- Overtourism
- Awareness General Scottish ticketing system, bus passes, company specific tickets, cycle routes and cycle friendly scheme, e-cars and bikes.
- Timetabling
- Bike space trains and buses
- Final Mile (ferry capacity)
- Infrastructure NC 500 RTIF
